Most every day The sun shines bright From six A.M. Till six at night.


> And where there's sun And sky this blue You're sure to see A shadow, too.

## Shadow birds and shadow cats,




Shadow chefs in shadow hats.


Shadows wearing Shadow shorts Spend the Night at Shadow sports.


> They fold And bend And stretch like Plastic. While you sleep They're quite Gymnastic.




Shadows order All they want At the shadow Restaurant. Though they've Eaten Huge amounts, **They still** Weigh only Half an
